1. Introduction

This document is a guide to the index and document bank of the surviving minutes for the pōraka (blocks) claims heard by the Papatupu Block Committees (PBC) of Te Taitokerau for whenua falling into the Te Paparahi o Te Raki Inquiry (Wai 1040) district.

This Papatupu Block Committee Minute Book index (PBCMBI) and document bank is the second part of project 4.5 from the Te Paparahi o Te Raki inquiry (Wai 1040) local issues research programme (LIRP). The PBCMBI is part of the approved recommendations¹ that indexes be produced to accompany document banks comprising the surviving Te Taitokerau Māori Land Court (MLC) minute books 1865 to 1910 (part 1), and Papatupu Block Committee minute books covering blocks within the Wai 1040 inquiry district (part 2). The Te Taitokerau MLC minute book 1865 to 1910 index (#A49(a)) and document bank (#A49) were filed in April 2015.

2. About the indexing project

The purpose of this project is to complete a searchable index of the Papatupu Block Committee (PBC) minute books. The index accompanies the document bank comprising surviving PMB (Papatupu Minute Book) volumes covering pōraka in the Wai 1040 inquiry district. It also includes details contained in the surviving PMB volumes about the committees' pōraka hearings in the Wai 1040 inquiry district held between October 1902 and January 1908. The index and document bank was compiled by Waitangi Tribunal staff.²

Brief historical context of the Papatupu Block Committees

The Papatupu Block Committees were established under sections 16-20 of the Māori Lands Administration Act 1900. The Act provided for the establishment of six District Māori Land Councils. These Councils had a strong Māori component, with elected and Crown-appointed members. The 1900 Act also empowered Māori claiming to be the owners of any particular block of papatupu (customary) land to form a Papatupu Block Committee. Committee membership could be diverse as members were elected for each block of land under consideration. The Māori Land Councils (Boards from 1905) confirmed proposed committee members. The Papatupu Block Committee then held their block title investigation hearing and reported to the Council with recommendations for awards of title. Provided there was no appeal to the Native Land Court against the committee's recommendation, the Council could confirm that recommendation. The recommended title award could then be ratified as if it were an order of the Native Land Court.

The Papatupu Block Committees operated largely in the Te Taitokerau and Tairāwhiti regions. The surviving minute books for the Te Taitokerau region cover the period January 1902 to January 1908. In her 1981 MA thesis entitled 'Participation: Native Committees (1883) and Papatupu Block Committees (1900) in Tai Tokerau', (Wai 1040 #A47) Jane McRae estimates there were around 70 committees in total. McRae cites figures from the Native Lands (Stout-Ngata) Commission 1907-1908 which show that by 1908 these committees had investigated the title to a total of 175,393 acres in all the counties north of Auckland, a feat the commissioners considered to be astonishing, with a considerable saving of money to the State (McRae, 1981, pp 78-79 citing AJHR 1908, G-1(j)).

The Stout-Ngata Commission statistics indicate that it was relatively uncommon for the District Māori Land Councils/Boards to confirm the recommendations made by the committees without an appeal about the committee's recommendations being lodged. Title recommendations to around 16 percent (28,315 acres) of the total area investigated by the Papatupu Block Committees operating in the counties north of Auckland appeared to have been confirmed by the Councils/Boards without appeals being lodged. In the case of appeals, title to that land was finally determined by the Native Land Court or the Native Appellate Court, or no title was issued.

The Papatupu Block Committees were abolished in 1909 when section 90 of the Native Land Act 1909 reinstated the Native Land Court's exclusive jurisdiction to investigate the title to customary land and to determine the relative interests of the owners in that land.

3. Index and document bank methodology

Arrangement of the index

The original PBC minute book volume numbering determines the order of this index. That is, entries are organised in order of the minute book number each volume was allocated instead of by pōraka names, dates or location. The original numbering for these surviving volumes ranges from PMB '04' to PMB '51A'. An interesting feature is that the PBC scribes did not use the books in sequential order. Some proceedings near the apparent end of PBC hearings in Te Taitokerau appear in lower numbered volumes than hearings held in earlier years. Conversely, other hearings held when the PBC first started in Te Taitokerau appear in books with higher volume numbers than for hearings held later. For instance, the earliest proceedings recorded in these surviving volumes – i.e. for Waikare pōraka in October 1902 – are contained in PMB '11' rather than the lowest numbered volume PMB '04'. Likewise the latest recorded proceedings – i.e. for Te Mimitu pōraka in January 1908 – are contained in PMB '23' rather than the latest numbered volume PMB '51A'.

It was hoped that the index could include specific entries identifying sites of significance within individual pōraka. A scoping exercise revealed that each pōraka in the minute books could be indexed but also that including every wāhi tapu and wāhi tūpuna was not feasible in the given timeframe. Therefore, the index entries are general descriptions of each pōraka in the Wai 1040 Inquiry district.

The PBCMBI is filed in both Adobe PDF and MS Excel formats to allow users to examine the lists using different search strategies. The total number of itemised entries in the PBCMBI is **79 entries**. These are made up of 68 pōraka and partitions thereof explicitly specified in the PMBs.

The Excel version of the PBCMBI, filed as a separate document, contains four additional columns to allow users to utilise Excel's 'sorting' and 'filtering' functions. These additions specify *Kaiwhakahaere*, *Kaikōrero*, *Kaitono* (Conductors, Speakers, Claimants), *Mema o Nga Kōmiti* (committee members) and start and end dates for each recorded hearing. For example, the filter functions can be sorted in date order of the recorded hearings. The Excel version also contains a separate spreadsheet list of the 339 participants involved in the hearings recorded in these PMBs either as committee members, speakers or conductors of claimant cases. Sections 6 and 7 below provide a step-by-step guide on how to use the particular Excel search functions for the Excel version.

Te Reo terminology used in the index

The PBC proceedings were recorded in te reo and in the local dialect, thought to be of Ngāpuhi origin. On occasion (although not often), some books show notes that scribes made to themselves in English. Although it is created in English, the PBCMBI emphasises te reo where possible. Specifically, the index uses te reo terminology that the participants are recorded as using in the proceedings. These terms were taken and made into headers, for example *Kaiwhakahaere*, *Kaikōrero* and *Kaitono* showing the conductors, speakers and claimants in the hearings. Macrons were excluded from the index due to inconsistent usage across all the books. In addition, it will enable users to find keywords, names or places efficiently within the pdf version.

4. Sources used for the index and document bank

The information used to create the PBCMBI came mostly from two prominent sources. The main source was the Māori Land Court Minute Book Index (MLCMBI) records, which included some records covering the PBC meetings in Te Taitokerau between 1902 and 1908. The other main source was the PBC minute books themselves examined for further information that could be included in the PBCMBI.

Māori Land Court Minute Book Index (MLCMBI)

Librarians at the New Zealand and Pacific Collection based at the University of Auckland Library Te Tumu Herenga created an online index covering the majority of Māori Land Court (MLC) minute books from 1865 to 1910. This online index also includes references to sittings recorded in most of the surviving PBC minutes for Te Taitokerau. Index entries for each block covered in the Wai 1040 inquiry area where the PBCs were active were examined, and relevant information was included in the PBCMBI. The MLCMBI record entries contain information such as the names of committee members (*Judges*), speakers/witnesses (*kaikōrero*), relevant hapu/iwi, and where possible, the location of the committee hearing. Information from the MLCMBI entries was used to help create the majority of the PBCMBI entries.

Papatupu Block Committee Minute Books

The PBC minute books with information about pōraka in the Wai 1040 Inquiry district were retrieved from the Te Taitokerau Māori Land Court (MLC) office in Whāngārei. All original books still in existence continue to be held securely within the MLC Te Taitokerau office and were released for digitisation purposes. Copies of originals no longer in existence are held mostly at the Auckland University Library, and these were also acquired for this project. Other copies came from Macmillan Brown Library (University of Canterbury) and Hocken Collections (University of Otago Library) although these were not used.

The books were scanned where there was written text and annotated with electronic notes describing irregularities such as missing pages or two-page viewing option, etc. The scans of each book start and end from cover to cover and are of a high resolution quality (totalling 3 Gigabytes in size). Pages numbered in the books were noted in the PBCMBI under the heading *Page Nos*. The *Notes* section of the index also records these page numbers in reference to specific sections of the books. For example, whakapapa chart citations include page numbers from the minute book. The digitisation work was completed by NZ Micrographic Services, Auckland with some specialist assistance preparing the books for digitisation from Spiral Path Book Studio, Auckland.

Papatupu Block Committee Books Index Tūpuna Names list

An alphabetical index of particular tūpuna names mentioned in the Te Taitokerau PBC minute books, a 'Native Committee' minute book from the 1880s (likely to be a surviving minute book of the Pewhairangi kōmiti) and a surviving Treaty of Waitangi Committee minute book, was also examined for the purposes of creating the PBCMBI. This 'tūpuna index' was sourced from Archives NZ, Auckland in the early stages of this project. The Archives NZ record (Item ID #R23454104 BAAQ 4466 A1755 170 / c AT92/112) shows that the Ministry of Māori Development Whāngārei deposited the index with Archives NZ between 1991 and

1992. It is labelled 'Papatupu Block Committee Books Index'. Unfortunately there is no acknowledgement of this index's author/s or when it was actually completed.

The list identifies tūpuna names and matches the associated minute book numbers, page numbers and pōraka name/s. A study of the minute books revealed that this tūpuna list is not fully complete; however, the index was accompanied by a set of instructions specifying that the tūpuna mentioned are those 'at the head of the whakapapa' outlined in the books indexed. Therefore, some of the entries in the PBCMBI mention tūpuna names in the *Notes* field that do not appear in this particular 'tūpuna index'. As this resource might be helpful to those looking for information about a prominent tūpuna, particularly if the tūpuna's name is known. The original index is appended to the index as Part Two to assist users.

Other research on the PBC

Other helpful sources included Henare Tate's *Karanga Hokianga* (1986), which contains part translations, and McRae's 1981 thesis, covering some aspects of how the PBCs functioned. Full references for these sources are as follows:

Te Kōmiti o Te Tiriti o Waitangi (Treaty of Waitangi Committee), 1881-1892

A surviving minute book of the Treaty of Waitangi Committee hearings (1881-1892) is included with the PBC minute books and in this index. The Kōmiti represented and protected a range of Te Taitokerau Māori rights and interests, including settling land disputes and investigating ownership (McRae, 1981, p.32).

The entries in this book range from 1881 – 1892, are not chronological, and most pages are missing. Due to the broad date range, variety of sittings and note takers, the contents of this minute book vary greatly as to style, pagination, and persons participating. It appears that some of the information contained in the minute book has been recorded retrospectively.

In the unnumbered pages at the back of the book there are lists of more than a hundred Committee members and their kāinga. There are also two templates for pānui announcing upcoming sittings of the Committee, and annual accounts showing Committee expenses for sittings across a number of years. Notes of three Committee sittings in relation to

Mowhironui Block, Matauri Block and Matawaia Block are also recorded. The on-line Māori Land Court Minute Book Index contains entries from this particular TOWMB.

Three pōraka heard by the Papatupu Block Committees in the 1900s were also investigated by Te Kōmiti o Te Tiriti o Waitangi between May and December 1890. Therefore, the relevant minutes in the book were taken at three Committee sittings in relation to Mowhironui, Matauri (including Motukawa[nui]) and Matawaia pōraka. Entries from this book are included in the PBCMBI and appear under the minute book reference *TOWMB*.

5. PBCMBI document bank

This document bank (DB) is a series of electronic documents saved in order of the original allocated PMB numbering for each surviving minute book. It comprises 38 surviving PMB volumes covering investigations for 67 pōraka between 1902 and 1908 that fall into the Wai 1040 inquiry district. As stated above, the PMBs for ‘Matauri’ and ‘Motukawa[nui]’ specifically refer to the TOW kōmiti minutes, the surviving Te Kōmiti o Te Tiriti o Waitangi minute book (TOWMB), which has also been included in this DB. A total of 39 minute book volumes appear in this index.

The sequential numbers of the document bank begins at 1 from the first page of the first minute book (PMB04), to the last page 8169 of the last book minute book, *TOWMB*. The PBCMBI shows the DB volume number and its specific page range within the DB’s 8169 pages. The document bank volumes and page numbers appear in the colour red throughout the minute books and are situated in the bottom right corner of each page.

The document bank volume numbering showing Vols 9 & 10 relate to PBC minute books 19 & 20

NB: There are two instances where the same minute book number was allocated to more than one physical volume i.e.:

- PMB 10 comprises two physical volumes. For the purposes of the PBCMBI these are recorded as ‘PMB10 vol i of ii’ and ‘PMB10 vol ii of ii’.
- PMB 34 comprises three physical volumes. For the purposes of the PBCMBI these are recorded as ‘PMB34 vol i of iii’, ‘PMB34 vol ii of iii’, and ‘PMB34 vol iii of iii’.

6. Guide to using the Excel version of the PBCMBI index

A few key features of the index are explained below.

Key references

Document Bank numbers	Number of pages of all the PMBs as one document which features in sequential order and is recorded as one large document bank. Appears in red text (pp.1-8169).
Minute Book References	PBC minute book number.
Tūingoa wāhi (Placenames)	Names of the pōraka (blocks); each name is qualified by its type in italics. The names have been recorded as they were written in the minute books.
Locations of hearings	Where the hearings were thought to be held.
Dates	Date range of the pōraka hearings. Includes a start and end date for when each pōraka was heard by the committee. The end date indicates when a committee reached a decision.
Page numbers	The primary source numbering which records the page numbers as these appear <u>in the minute books</u> .
Whānau, Hapū, Iwi	Whānau, hapū and iwi participating in committee hearing, or else mentioned in witness testimonies.
Kaiwhakahaere, Kaikōrero, Kaitono	Mentions the parties who spoke during committee hearings for a particular pōraka or about sites within a pōraka. Recorded as surname first, first name second and separated by a semi colon.
Mema o Ngā Kōmiti	MLCMBI records these groups as <i>Judges</i> – but these are the committee members who heard the PBC cases. The first name that appears in the list is the <i>Heamana</i> (Chair), followed by fellow panel members. Recorded as surname first, first name second and separated by a semi colon.
Notes	References general points of interest to index users. Occasionally provides a brief description of the proceedings. Refers to page numbers of the committee decisions. Points out the pages that feature claimant whakapapa as evidence showing eponymous tūpuna of a pōraka.

Filter search function

The index was created with the filter search function on Excel to allow users to find the information they need. Filter search allows users to filter out the information they don't want, and leaves behind what they want to see. It enables filtering of the cells that have been selected – in this case, the whole index.



- **How do I use filter search?**

1. Click on the **Data** tab.



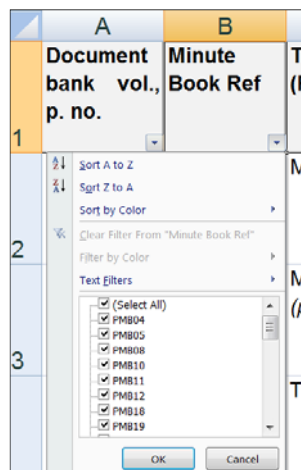
2. Click on the **Filter** button, which is sitting on the Sort and Filter tab (Ctrl+Shift+L).

3. You will see that all the column headings will have a small box (with a small

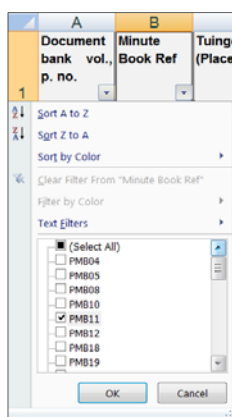
triangle) to the bottom right-hand corner . Select the triangle  and you will see a drop-down menu.

4. The filter drop-down menu contains a list box with a complete list of all entries made in that column, each with its own checkbox. You can filter out the data you don't want to see by checking the boxes you are interested in looking at.

5. For example – if you were looking for info in a particular minute book, such as PMB11 you would first select the drop-down menu of Minute Book Ref.



Clear selection by unticking **(Select All)**.



Select PMB11 and OK.

The final filter search will only reveal all pōraka (blocks) that were mentioned in PBC minute book No.11. It will not show the rest of the information in the spreadsheet.

6. To see all the entries after a filter search, click **Filter** button again (Ctrl+Shift+L).

Best use of the Filter Search function in the Excel spreadsheet

The filter search function works best when selecting options from the following columns:

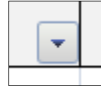
- **Minute Book reference.** Allows you to see the PBC minute books you wish to see, and leave out the ones you don't want to see.
- **Tūingoa wāhi (Placename).** Allows you to see all the names followed by a qualifier telling us what type of place it is (ie either pōraka or wāhi tapu).
- **Location** of where the hearings took place.
- **Dates**, particularly **start** and **end** dates. Allows you to search by year, month and day. (NB: 19th century dates appear at the end)



The five columns above refer to the best filter search options in the index - minute book numbers, tūingoa wāhi (placenames), hearing location and the start and end dates.

- **Why should I use Text Filters?**

Text filter works in fields with only text or a combination of text, date and numeric entries. When highlighted, a submenu appears providing a number of options. The recommended option to use in this index is the *Contains* function as it useful for finding particular words or phrases in long strings of text, such as names.



1. Select the  in the corner of the column heading box.

2. Select **Text Filters** and a submenu of options will appear.

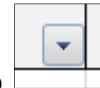

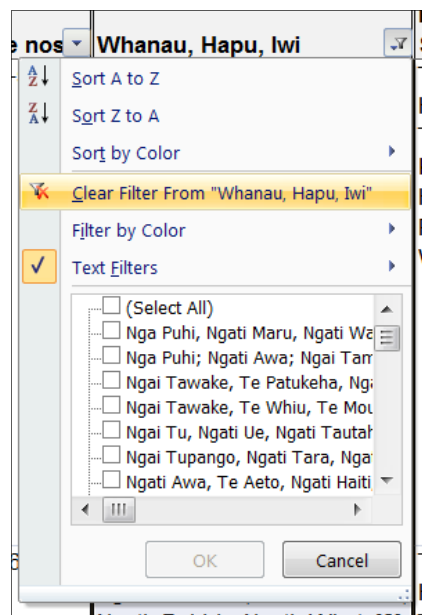

4. The *Contains* function will match with records where the entry in the field contains the special text. For example, when using the text filter *Contains* and “Waiariki” two entries appeared when searching for pōraka relating to Te Waiariki.

5. Don't forget to reset the search. You will need to open the filter tab and click on *Clear Filter From* option. Or you can click **Filter** button from the **Data** tab on the top left side (Ctrl+Shift+L).



7. Guide to using the nominal list of PBC participants

PBC Participants names list in Excel spreadsheet

Personal names of participants in the PBC hearings are listed in the Excel spreadsheet version of the index. A total of 339 names of people involved in the hearings were recorded. The list is organised by surname, first given name, range of years that the participants were active in the hearings and roles that they had in the hearing process. It has been created to allow users to use the filter search function.

Key references

Surnames	Surnames as shown on the record. Usually the last name noted and consistently used throughout the books.
First Names	First given names recorded in the minutes and used consistently throughout the books.
Date 1	Earliest known dates that participants were active in the hearings.
Date 2	Approximate time when participants ended their involvement with these hearings.
Roles	<p>The types of roles the participants had in the hearing procedures. These have been colour coded according to the role/s they held in the hearings.</p> <p>K = <u>K</u>aiwhakahaere, <u>K</u>aikōrero or <u>K</u>aitono (Conductors, Speakers or Claimants).</p> <p>M = Ngā <u>M</u>ema o Ngā Kōmiti (Committee Members).</p> <p>K/M = Participants who appeared as both K and M.</p>
Minute Book Numbers	Minute book numbers which feature participant names.
