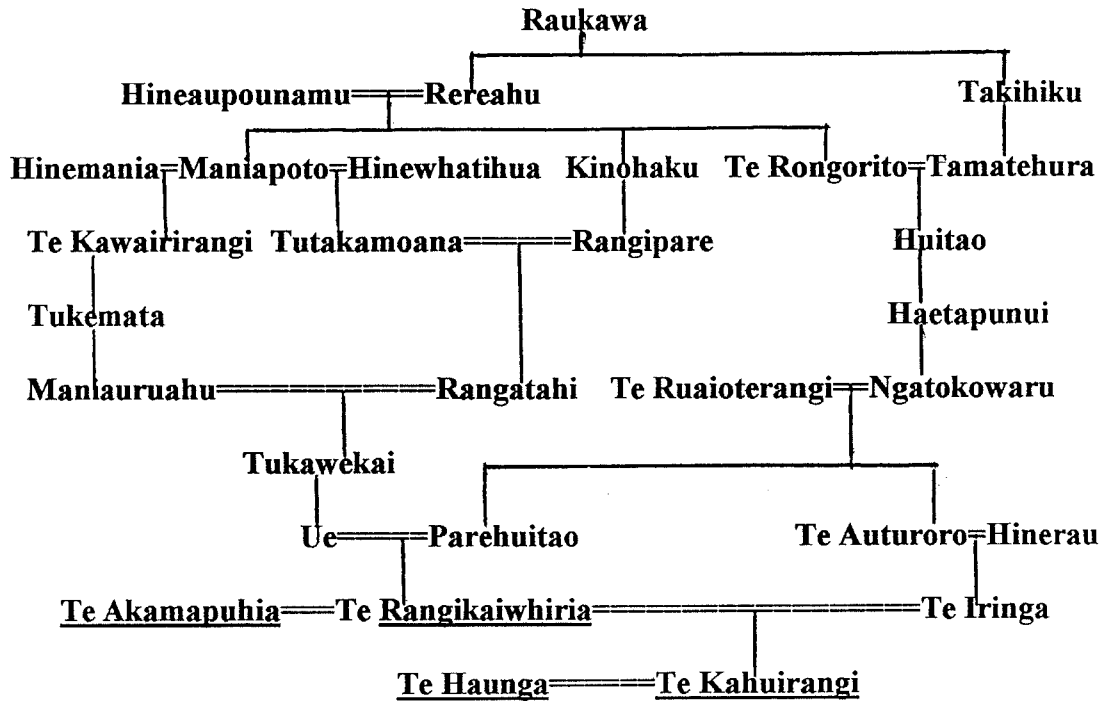

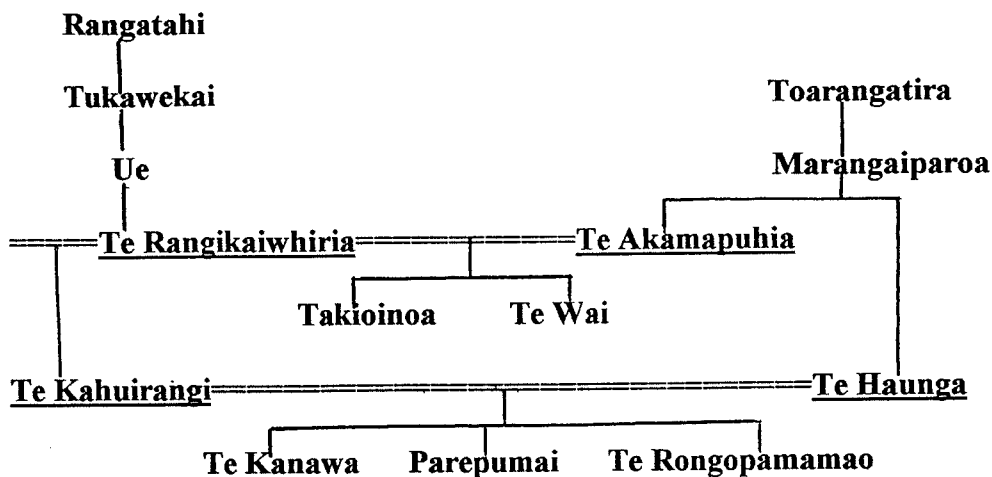
Relationships between the descendants of Toarangatira and Rangatahi.

Whakapapa:



It was as a consequence of the death of Tukawekai that Toarangatira took his grand-daughter Te Akamapuhia to Maungatautari where she became the wife of Te Rangikaiwhiria. On the same occasion he took Te Kahuirangi back to Kawhia where she became the wife of Te Haunga, younger brother of Te Akamapuhia.

The death of Tukawekai ended the battle fought in the vicinity of Waiharakeke known as "Opua-ta-ngehe". Tukawekai being killed by Toarangatira. Two further battles followed in quick succession "Te Moanawaipu" fought in the vicinity of Te Maika and finally one at Motu-Ngaio which left Ngati Mango in control of Kawhia proper and the coast on the north and south of the harbour.



It is said that Ngatokowaru who was the grandfather of both Te Rangikaiwhiria and his first wife, Te Iringa was instrumental in helping to arrange these marriages.

He is said to have had a reasonably good relationship with Toarangatira, Kawharu and others of Ngati Mango and of course was an Uncle and blood relative of Tukawekai.
