MAY IT PLEASE THE TRIBUNAL:

- 1. This Memorandum of Counsel is filed on behalf of the Ngāti Hine Forestry Trust (Wai 2397) ("the claimants").
- 2. By way of Memorandum-Directions dated 8 October 2024, her Honour Judge Milroy directed that any evidence to be heard at hearing one be filed by no later than 5pm, Monday 21 October 2024.1
