(Campbell) claim**MEMORANDUM-DIRECTIONS OF THE DEPUTY CHAIRPERSON**

The Registrar is directed to add to Wai 2728 an amended statement of claim received on 23 July 2024 and to record its date of receipt in the register of claims.

This amendment seeks to add further allegations to the claim concerning mental health and addiction services. These allegations include the Crown's failure to:


- ensure that the mental wellbeing framework addresses the inadequate design and provision of health services for Māori in Ōpōtiki, the East Coast, and surrounding areas;
- ensure equitable funding pathways for services providers in Ōpōtiki, the East Coast and surrounding areas who are seeking to improve mental health and addiction issues for their whānau and hapū;
- address institutional racism and the explicit and implicit bias that whānau and hapū experience in seeking to access mental health and addictions services;
- collect quality data on and monitor inequities for whānau and hapū with mental health and addiction problems;
- improve cross-sector and people and whānau centred approaches to mental health and addiction service provision; and
- adequately provide accountability structures and audit measures to eliminate inequity in health outcomes for whānau and hapū experiencing mental health and addiction problems.

The amendment is to be entered on Wai 2728, the Mental Health Services (Campbell) claim, as document #1.1.1(e).

The Registrar is to send a copy of this direction to the claimants and give notice of the amendment to those on the notification list for:

- Wai 2728, the Mental Health Services (Campbell) claim; and
- Wai 2575, the Health Services and Outcomes Kaupapa Inquiry.
