Northland Region Corrections Facility (Ngāwhā prison)	Kaikohe, Northland	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A facility associated with targeted research. • A facility that was established to operate under a special relationship with mana whenua. • A facility which incorporates Māori architectural design and was intended to operate on a Kaupapa Māori basis.
Auckland Prison (Paremoremo)	Pāremoremo, Auckland	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New Zealand's only maximum-security prison. • The Prisoners of Extreme Risk Unit (PERU).
Auckland Region Women's Corrections Facility	Wiri, South Auckland	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A women's prison. • Māori targeted responsiveness initiatives, such as Mirimiri Te Aroha (Māori focus Unit).
Spring Hill Corrections Facility	Te Kauwhata, Waikato	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Puna Tatari: a Special Treatment Unit, combining Western psychological therapies with Māori cultural concepts. • Te Whare Oranga Ake operated by Raukura Hauora o Tainui under licence from Ara Poutama Aotearoa (Department of Corrections). • Like Ngāwhā, another regional prisons project which was established to operate under a special relationship with iwi.
Waikeria Prison	Waikeria, Te Awamutu	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Māori Focus Unit (Te Ao Mārama) • A Special Treatment Unit (Karaka). • A dedicated mental health and addiction unit.
Hawke's Bay Regional Prison	Mangaroa, Hastings	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Te Whare Oranga Ake operated by Choices Kahungunu Health Services under licence from Ara Poutama Aotearoa. • Te Whare Tirohanga Māori (the first Māori focus unit in the country).
