MEMORANDUM-DIRECTIONS OF THE PRESIDING OFFICER

Introduction

1. On 13 March 2013, the Tribunal directed parties to provide any final submissions about the issue questions for Stage Two of this inquiry, and also to advise the Tribunal as to the research and evidence that they intended to prepare for Stage Two (Wai 2358, #2.5.36).
2. On 5 April 2013, the Crown, claimants, and interested parties filed submissions in response to the Tribunal's direction. We also received two later submissions from Ms Annette Sykes and from Ms Kathy Ertel, representing a number of interested parties. Ms Ertel sought leave to file submissions at midday today, and that leave was granted.
3. In their submissions to the Tribunal, the Crown and the Wai 2358 claimants have proposed a new way forward for this inquiry, involving discussions to narrow the issues and, if possible, to reach agreed positions on most of the Stage Two issues.

The parties' submissions

4. In the claimants' submission (Wai 2358, #3.1.191), concessions made by the Crown during the Supreme Court proceedings were such that 'the issues that need to be determined at Stage Two can be significantly narrowed. In particular, it is possible that an agreed view may be able to be formed between the Crown and NZMC and the co-claimants on much if not all of the substance of issues (e)-(h)' As a result, in the claimants' submission, the Tribunal's inquiry might possibly be restricted to the making of recommendations under issue (i), if the Crown and claimants can reach an agreed position as to Treaty breach. The claimants therefore requested an opportunity to 'further discuss this issue with the Crown and hope that those discussions will significantly narrow the issues.' Claimant counsel advised that informal discussions have already taken place. The claimants intend to meet with the Crown towards the end of April and hope to then file a joint memorandum setting out the results.
5. Crown counsel supported the proposal that the Crown and claimants confer further on a 'cooperative approach to the inquiry' (Wai 2358, #3.1.188). They suggested that the Tribunal schedule a short teleconference so as to 'enable the parties an opportunity to develop a joint approach to the issues and hearing for the Tribunal's final consideration'.


6. The interested parties, of course, were not aware of this development when they made their submissions on 5 April 2013. For the most part, the interested parties either accepted or made no submissions about the proposed issue questions for Stage Two. Ms Ertel, however, has suggested that the issue questions may need some amendment, to reflect Stage 1 findings and to broaden the scope of issue question (f) (see Wai 2358, #3.1.201). The interested parties also mainly reserved their position on the filing of evidence, awaiting the finalisation of the Stage Two issues and (in some cases) the evidence yet to be filed by other parties. Some interested parties outlined the evidence that they intend to call in Stage Two. Issues were also raised about the status of interested parties, and whether some groups should now be considered claimants rather than interested parties for the next stage of this inquiry.¹

Directions

7. The Tribunal welcomes the proposal for the Crown and claimants to confer and reach agreed positions on Stage Two issues. The Crown and claimants are directed to file a joint memorandum, updating the Tribunal and other parties as to progress and results, no later than **midday, Friday 24 May 2013**.
8. After receipt of this memorandum, the Tribunal will convene a judicial conference to consider the progress that has been made, and to hear submissions from all parties as to the future scope and direction of this inquiry.
9. Any other outstanding issues, such as the requests of some interested parties for full party status, would also be considered at that conference.

The Registrar is directed to send a copy of this memorandum-directions to counsel for the claimants, Crown counsel and all those on the distribution list for Wai 2358, the National Fresh Water and Geothermal Resources Inquiry.
