MEMORANDUM-DIRECTIONS OF JUDGE D J AMBLER
CONCERNING CONSOLIDATION-AGGREGATION AND
OUTCOMES FROM THE FIFTH JUDICIAL CONFERENCE

31 JULY 2009

Tēnā koutou

1. Introduction

1.1 In this memorandum-directions I:

1.1.1 Set out my responses to submissions filed on consolidation and aggregation of claims in the Te Rohe Pōtae district inquiry and provide updated provisional lists of consolidated, aggregated and 'more information required' (MIR) claims for this inquiry. These are attached in Appendix A;

1.1.1.2 Clarify my decision on river boundaries generally, respond to issues raised under this agenda item at the fifth judicial conference, and request Tribunal staff to make any necessary changes to the river boundaries paper (Wai 898 #6.2.14) and to distribute the amended version to all parties;

1.1.3 Reiterate my position with regard to the Waikato River Agreement in Principle and settlement legislation;

1.1.4 Request Tribunal staff to respond in writing to research issues raised before the fifth judicial conference (Wai 898 #3.1.214);

1.1.5 Request the Crown Forestry Rental Trust (CFRT) to advise of the estimated completion date of their part of the research casebook;

1.1.6 Advise counsel to hold meetings to begin to coordinate and organise themselves as a group;

1.1.7 Direct counsel to submit memoranda on "hot-tubbing", waterways, the emissions trading scheme and the focus group;

1.1.8 Direct counsel to file submissions regarding the hearing of oral traditions evidence, and suggest some headings around which such proposals might be structured.

2 Consolidation and aggregation of claims

2.1 Mr Warren requested that Wai 1360 be consolidated into this inquiry (Wai 898 #3.1.213). As the Tokanui block falls entirely within the Te Rohe Pōtae inquiry district, this claim is now consolidated into this inquiry.

2.2 Mr Warren also requested that Wai 1137 be aggregated into this inquiry (Wai 898 #3.1.213). As the claim area covers a wider area than the Te Rohe Pōtae inquiry district, this claim is now aggregated into this inquiry.

2.3 Professor Boast requested that the following Raukawa claims: MIR 5204, Wai 1769, Wai 2076, Wai 2019, Wai 2078, Wai 2077, and MIR 5391; be aggregated into the Te Rohe Pōtae district inquiry as each claims interest in the Wharepuhanga block which falls within the district boundary (Wai 898 #3.1.218).

- 2.4 MIR 5391 has now been registered as Wai 2098. As MIR 5204 is not a registered claim, it cannot be aggregated into the inquiry (Wai 898 #3.1.218).
- 2.5 As there is no mention of interests in the Wharepuhanga block in the statements of claim for Wai 1769, Wai 2019, Wai 2076, Wai 2077, Wai 2078 and Wai 2098, these claims should not be aggregated into this inquiry (Wai 898 #3.1.218).
- 2.6 At the fifth judicial conference Mr Pou requested that Wai 1408 be aggregated into the Te Rohe Pōtae district inquiry. As the claim relates to issues that have been heard within the Whanganui and National Park district inquiries and also to issues that will be heard within the Rohe Pōtae district, this claim is now aggregated.
- 2.7 At the fifth judicial conference Mr Pou requested that Wai 1029 be included in the Te Rohe Pōtae district inquiry. As the Taurewa blocks are outside of this inquiry district, it is not clear from the Wai 1029 statement of claim how it fits the criteria for aggregation. Mr Pou is either to outline his rationale for the claim's inclusion in this inquiry via memorandum or file an amended statement of claim.
- 2.8 Updated provisional lists of consolidated, aggregated and MIR claims for this inquiry are attached in Appendix A. Many new claims filed in the lead-up to the September 1, 2008 deadline for the filing of historical claims are awaiting further details from claimants before they meet the criteria for registration. A further update will be provided when these claims have been processed.

3 River Boundaries

- 3.1 At the fifth judicial conference Dr James Mitchell presented a paper proposing a way of addressing the inclusion of rivers which form or cross the boundaries of the inquiry district. Parties were invited to discuss this issue.
- 3.2 Having considered these discussions, I direct that the Te Rohe Pōtae district inquiry should adopt a broad principle of considering all aspects of river claims from those groups which are participating in this inquiry where rivers form or cross the district inquiry boundaries. However, claims will not be heard in cases where these groups' issues have been heard in full by another inquiry or where the Tribunal's jurisdiction to hear them has been explicitly removed by legislation.
- 3.3 At the fifth judicial conference Mr Armstrong, counsel for Wai 775, requested an explanation as to why Ohautira Stream and the Waingaro River have been excluded from the inquiry district. Mr Armstrong argued that as part of the coastline surrounding the Whaingaroa Harbour forms part of the inquiry district boundary, Ohautira Stream and the Waingaro River, both of which flow into this harbour, should also be included in the inquiry. As neither of these waterways fall within or upon the boundary of the inquiry district, but rather flow into the Whaingaroa Harbour at a point north of the district boundary and east of the Te Akau Block extension area, issues in relation to Ohautira Stream and the Waingaro River will not be included in the inquiry.

3.4 Mr Armstrong noted an error in the river boundaries paper at the fifth judicial conference. Dr Mitchell is to amend the relevant maps in his river boundaries paper to reflect that Kaiwhaniwhani Stream does not connect with the Waitetuna River.

3.5 Mr Bennion also asked that the paper be amended to include Lake Ngaroto as a waterway which forms part of the inquiry boundary. Dr Mitchell advises me that on further examination, while Lake Ngaroto does fall within the northern extension area to the district, it does not form part of any of the inquiry district boundaries and hence need not be depicted in the paper.

4 Waikato-Tainui Raupatu Claims Settlement Bill

4.1 Issues were raised at the fifth judicial conference regarding the Waikato River Agreement in Principle signed in September 2008 and the "Waikato Tainui Raupatu Claims (Waikato River) Settlement Bill" which is currently before the House. As I stated at the judicial conference, I do not have jurisdiction to inquire into any alleged prejudice arising from this legislation. It is the role of claimant counsel to advise their clients on their options in this matter.

5 Waitangi Tribunal Research

5.1 Dr Mitchell is to respond in writing to research issues raised in writing by counsel in advance of the fifth judicial conference (Wai 898 #3.1.214).

6 Crown Forestry Rental Trust Research

6.1 CFRT staff are to advise when they believe they will complete their part of the casebook research for the inquiry.

7 Counsel Submissions

7.1 Mr Singh is to file a submission on "hot-tubbing", waterways, the emissions trading scheme and the focus group as per his request at the fifth judicial conference.

8 Counsel Meetings to Discuss Common Claim Issues

8.1 As I stated at the fifth judicial conference, I strongly advise counsel to meet to begin to coordinate and organise themselves as a group. The pace of the inquiry will accelerate from this point on given the prospect of holding oral traditions hearings. I expect counsel to take a greater role in progressing the inquiry than has been the case to date.

9 Counsel Submissions on the New Process for hearing Oral Traditions

9.1 There was overwhelming support for the proposal regarding the hearing of oral traditions. In light of the discussion at the conference and the need for some counsel to take further instructions I direct counsel to file submission on some or all of the following issues:


9.1.1 Name for process;

- 9.1.2 Venues and duration of hui;
- 9.1.3 Identification of themes;
- 9.1.4 Role of speakers, claimants, counsel and the Tribunal;
- 9.1.5 Translation, recording and transcription of kōrero and related issues of confidentiality and protection of intellectual knowledge;
- 9.1.6 Relationship of hui and oral traditions to later hearings and tribal or historical research;
- 9.1.7 Settlement of protocol for hui;
- 9.1.8 Other issues.

10 Deadline

- 10.1 The deadline for filing any submissions or providing responses to the various issues raised above is 12pm, Friday 28 August 2009.
